

**WOLVERHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL**  
**THE WOLVERHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL (COCKSHUTTS LANE,**  
**WOLVERHAMPTON) GATING ORDER 2007**

This Order is made by Wolverhampton City Council ("the Council") under Section 129A of the Highways Act 1980 because it appears to the Council that the cul-de-sac at Cockshutts Lane Wolverhampton is affected by crime and anti-social behaviour by the existence of the highway described below is facilitating the persistent commission of crime and it is in all the circumstances expedient to make this Order for the purpose of reducing crime and anti-social behaviour.

**BY THIS ORDER:**

1. The public right of way over the highway shown on the plan attached ("the plan") and described in the Schedule to this Order ("the highway") will be restricted during the hours of 6.00pm to 6.00am by the erection of vehicular and pedestrian gates across the highway at the location marked on the plan ("the gates").
2. Access to the highway will be permitted by the provision of keys to the occupiers of the Marlborough Industrial Estate, residents of Thompson Avenue, their visitors and the Emergency Services.
3. The maintenance of the gates will be the responsibility of the Highways Division of the Council at Heantun House, Salop Street, Wolverhampton with Mr Gwyn James being the point of contact on telephone number 01902 555755.

SCHEDULE TO THE ORDER  
THE CUL-DE-SAC

The highway running from a point off Thompson Avenue at the point marked A on the Plan continuing in a southerly direction to the point marked B on the plan being a distance of approximately 85 metres.
