The Directory is intended for use by advisers, local groups and organisations who wish to find out about the support services that are available within Wolverhampton for individuals needing help with welfare benefits, debt, housing, employment and other issues.

Local groups and organisations are listed alphabetically. If you know the name of the local group or organisation you are looking for, you can simply scroll down (or in the case of a printed paper copy browse) to find it or you can 'click' on the name of the local group or organisation in the alphabetical list to go straight to the entry.

If you are looking for a service by type (e.g. benefits advice or debt advice), you can go to the Service Type Index where organisations are listed according to the type of advice and information service they provide. You can then 'click' on the name of the local group or

organisation name you require under the appropriate service type and you will be taken to the relevant entry.

If you are using a paper copy of the Directory, you may use the index pages to find which local groups/organisations provide the type of service you require.

Please note that some local groups and organisations are listed under more than one heading because they provide services in more than one area.

The geographical location of local groups and organisations listed in the Directory can be found by 'clicking' on the 'view location here' message next to the address. This will take you to a *Google Map* pin-pointing the groups or organisation's location.

You can also use the entry to go directly to the local groups/organisation's web page or email address by 'clicking' on the web/email address.

Welfare Rights Service

The Welfare Rights Service Specialist Support Team (SST) provides a range of services aimed at informing local groups and organisations about welfare law and supporting them in the provision of information and advice. The SST provides a variety of training courses on benefits and places on these courses are mostly free to those from local groups and organisations.

If you volunteer for a local group or organisation, you may contact the SST directly for information and advice on individual cases in which you are involved by email at WRS@wolverhampton.gov.uk or by phone on 01902 555351.

If you are emailing outside the City of Wolverhampton Council's email system regarding a particular person, we ask that you do not include any full name details (initials will suffice) or any specific, personal information.

This is because the security of the email cannot be guaranteed. The SST may also be able to arrange tribunal representation through its Law Student Representation Project in appeal cases involving the Personal Independence Payment, the Work Capability Assessment and benefit sanctions. Similarly, in some situations (e.g. an important test case scenario or a case involving a very vulnerable person with complex benefit issues) the SST may take a direct case referral.

Universal Credit Supplement

Universal Credit has now been rolled out in Wolverhampton albeit that 'managed migration' is yet to be implemented. This has increased the need for specialist help and surrounding Universal Credit entitlement, including practical help and guidance to navigate the digital claims process and budgeting support. People will also need information and advice on the 'claimant commitment' expectations and sanctions that may be imposed when they break their claimant commitment. Therefore, it was decided to produce a Universal Credit supplement to the main Directory, outlining the support that local groups and organisations can offer in these areas.
