REPORT ON BEHALF OF THE CLAIMANTS ON THE OPERATION OF THE INJUNCTION

Introduction

- On13 February 2023 the Honourable Mr Justice Freedman granted the Claimants an interim injunction that sought to address the issue of Car Cruising/Street Racing that was being carried on in their local authority areas.
- That order continued an urgent without notice injunction that had been granted by the Honourable Mrs Justice Hill on 21 December 2022.
- Subject to the addition of a fourth Defendant those orders were continued by order of the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie, sealed on 23 May 2023 [D145]

- 4 Ritchie J directed *inter alia* that the matter return to court for a further review hearing and
 - "Not less than 7 days prior to the hearing the Wolverhampton claimants...shall file with the Court case summaries to inform the Court of the current position in particular in relation to the awaited judgment of the Supreme Court in *Wolverhampton CC v London Gypsies and Travellers and others* [2022] UKSC/0046 and any current enforcement proceedings and Defendants to be named in connection with the interim injunction and/or the power of arrest." [D149/4(c)]
- This is that Report. I am Adam Sheen, Solicitor-Advocate (Civil and Criminal) and employed as Senior Solicitor with Wolverhampton City Council. I have the authority of all four Claimants to submit this Report on their behalf.
- In compiling the report I have relied on several sources of information. That information will be before the court in the form of witness statements. I do not intend to repeat the witness statements but will, where appropriate, refer to the information contained therein.
- 7 The witness statements are contained in a bundle filed with the court.
 References to the bundle appear in square brackets with the page

number appearing first followed if appropriate by the paragraph number.

Publication

- The Tenth to Fifteenth [B30-195], witness statements of Paul Brown address the issue of compliance with the terms of the orders regarding publicity.
- The Tenth and Eleventh witness statements address the steps taken to publicise the hearing in May 2023 before Ritchie J and the partial non-compliance with the earlier orders.
- The Twelfth witness statement [B83-90] sets out the steps taken to comply with the order of Ritchie J with regard to publicising the outcome of the hearing on 19 May 2023. The Thirteenth witness statement [B123-125] sets out the steps taken to publicise the Amended Claim Form.
- The Fourteenth witness statement [B128-136] addresses steps taken to publicise this hearing following a change to the date of hearing.

 The Fifteenth witness statement [B185-188] provides details of the First Claimant's social media activities to publicise the orders.

Operation

The Injunction has now been in effect for over nine months and has achieved a substantial measure of success. However, the longer summer evenings have seen a rise in street racing and an increase in the activities of the Police to restrain it. Residents remain concerned about the effects of street racing and complaints have increased.

Enforcement

- During the course of the hearing before Ritchie J on 19 May 2023 the judge expressed the view that the if the Injunction was necessary so was enforcement ("use it or lose it"). Since then enforcement has been used actively in conjunction with the Police.

The Supreme Court

At the time of writing there is no indication of when the Supreme Court is likely to give judgment of the Supreme Court in Wolverhampton CC v London Gypsies and Travellers and others [2022] UKSC/0046.

17 The Court will reconvene on 2 October 2023. The Court did give a judgement on 20 September 2023 for a case heard in January 2023¹.

Conclusions

All four Claimants support the continuation of the Injunction and regard it as effective in reducing anti-social behaviour and promoting public safety.

AMENDED PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

Introduction

- 1 Part 8 of the Civil Procedure Rules 1998 applies to this claim.
- In these Particulars of Claim the following definitions have been applied:
 - (1) "The Black Country" the combined local authority areas of all the Claimants. The Claimants areas are shown on the plan annexed hereto (Plan A).
 - (2) "Car Cruising" organised or impromptu events at which drivers of cars race, perform driving stunts, drive dangerously and drive in convoy. Such activities may be noisy, dangerous and illegal, obstructing highways and the premises bordering them, damaging property and putting the safety of spectators and other persons at risk.

- (3) The "Original Injunction" Injunction granted by HHJ Owen QC on 1 December 2014 and renewed by HHJ McKenna on 9 January 2018 in *Wolverhampton & Others v Persons Unknown* [2014] (Claim No A90BM228) which was in effect from 2 February 2015
- (4) "Stunts" Driving manoeuvres often undertaken as part of car cruising including:
 - (a) "Burnouts" Causing a vehicle to destroy its tyres by applying power to the drive wheels while braking so as to remain in place while the wheels revolve at speed.
 - (b) "Donuts/Donutting" Causing a vehicle to rotate around a fixed point (normally the front axle) while not movingoff causing noise, smoke and tyre marks to be created.
 - (c) "Drifting" Turning by placing the vehicle in a skid so that most sideways motion is due to the skid not any significant steering input.
 - (d) "Undertaking" passing a vehicle on its nearside so as to overtake in circumstances not permitted by the Highway Code.
- The Claimants are local authorities with the meaning of the Local Government Act 1972.
- The West Midland Police Force ('the Police') serve the areas of all the Claimants.

- Since, at least, 2012 the Claimants have, in co-operation with the Police, have been attempting to eliminate car cruising in their areas.
- By this claim the Claimants seek an injunction restraining car cruising across the whole of the Black Country.

Background

- 7 The Claimants obtained the Original Injunction which was in effect from 2 February 2015 until 1 February 2021.
- The Claimants aver that the Original Injunction caused or contributed to a substantial reduction in car cruising in the Black Country and the committal proceedings brought for breach of the Original Injunction served as a deterrent to persons contemplating car cruising.
- 9 The Original Injunction did not eliminate car cruising but did cause a decrease in such activity. Since the order lapsed there has been a marked increase.

Relevant Enactments

10 Section 37(1) Senior Courts Act 1981 provides that:

"The High Court may by order (whether interlocutory or final) grant an injunction or appoint a receiver in all cases in which it appears to the court to be just and convenient to do so."

11 For the reasons set out in the evidence filed herewith (and the evidence in support of the application for the Original Injunction) the Claimants will contend it is just and convenient for the honourable court to grant an injunction in this instance.

12 Section 111(1) Local Government Act 1972 provides that:

"Without prejudice to any powers exercisable apart from this section but subject to the provisions of this Act and any other enactment passed before or after this Act, a local authority shall have power to do anything (whether or not involving the expenditure, borrowing or lending of money or the acquisition or disposal of any property or rights) which is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive or incidental to, the discharge of any of their functions."

- Section 222 Local Government Act 1972 extends that power and empowers local authorities to become involved in litigation if so doing facilitates the discharge of their functions and is in the interest of their inhabitants.
- 14 Section 222(1) Local Government Act 1972 provides that:

- (1) "Where a local authority consider it expedient for the promotion or protection of the interests of the inhabitants of their area—
 - (a) they may prosecute or defend or appear in any legal proceedings and, in the case of civil proceedings, may institute them in their own name, and
 - (b) they may, in their own name, make representations in the interests of the inhabitants at any public inquiry held by or on behalf of any Minister or public body under any enactment."
- Further, section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 provides that a local authority has power to do anything that individuals may do.
- Accordingly, the Claimants are entitled to bring this claim for the benefit of all inhabitants of the Black Country. Further it is just and convenient and in accordance with the overring objective for all the Claimants to bring a single claim.
- By section 130, Highways Act 1980, the Claimants are under a duty to assert and protect the rights of the public to the use and enjoyment of any highway for which they are the highway authority. The injunctive relief sought in these proceedings is necessary to protect the rights of the public to the use and enjoyment of highways within the Claimants' districts.

By section 6 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998, local authorities must formulate and implement, *inter alia*, a strategy for the reduction of crime and disorder in their areas (including anti-social and other behaviour adversely affecting the local environment), which strategy the authorities must keep under review for the purposes of monitoring its effectiveness and making any necessary or expedient changes.

19 Section 17(1) Crime and Disorder Act 1998 provides that:

"Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed on it, it shall be the duty of each authority to which this section applies to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area."

The Claimants contend that taking measures to combat car cruising falls within and forms part of their statutory function (set out above) to reduce crime and disorder in their areas.

Factual Background

The Claimants will rely upon the witness statements filed with this Claim Form and those filed in support of the adjourned application to extend the Original Injunction.

22 In summary the Claimants aver that:

- (1) Persons participating in car cruising meet on highways and areas adjacent to highways. Such areas include industrial estates and carparks.
- (2) The locations for such meetings vary but are to be found throughout the Black Country.
- (3) Such meetings may be publicised in advance via social media or word of mouth or may be impromptu.
- (4) At such meetings some or all of conduct set out above takes place.
- (5) Such conduct affects the safety, comfort, well-being and livelihoods of inhabitants of the Black Country.
- (6) Such conduct diverts the resources of the Police, Ambulance Service and hospitals away from other legitimate matters.
- The Original Injunction was effective in reducing and inhibiting car cruising.

- 24 Since 2 February 2021 car cruising has again increased with more events and larger numbers of spectators at such events. The Police are receiving an increased volume of calls relating to such activities.
- Such increased activity has continued following the relaxation of restrictions on social gatherings imposed during the covid-19 pandemic. There appears to be a growing perception among those who engage in car cruising that the Claimants and the Police are impotent to restrict the activity.
- 25A The conduct described above frequently involves the commission of criminal offences which is deliberate and which cannot adequately be prevented or restrained by the use of criminal law sanctions.
- 25B Such offences may include but are not limited to:
 - (1) Dangerous driving;
 - (2) Speeding;
 - (3) Racing;
 - (4) Driving without insurance
- 25C The said conduct is also tortious and, in particular, constitutes a public nuisance.

- 25D Further, by engaging in the conduct described above, the Defendants infringe or threaten to infringe
 - (1) other road users' and pedestrians' right to life, pursuant to Article 2, European Convention on Human Rights (the "Convention").
 - On 20 November 2022 a fatal road traffic collision occurred in the area of the Third Defendant when a vehicle collided with persons spectating at a cruise/street race.

and/or

- (2) the right to respect for the private and family lives, pursuant to Article 8, Convention, of residents living in the locality of the roads or spaces used for street-cruising.
- While all persons have the right to freedom of association and peaceful assembly (Convention, Art.11), such rights are qualified and may lawfully be interfered with in the interests of public safety, for the prevention of disorder or crime, for the protection of health or morals or for the protection of the rights and freedoms of others.
- 25F Such rights do not extend to permitting the commission of serious criminal activity that imperils the lives of others.

25G Injunctive relief sought is necessary in a democratic society and is proportionate. It represents the only way to protect the rights referred to above and is in accordance with a legitimate aim.

Justification for an Injunction

- An Injunction in the terms sought would assist the Claimants in discharging their statutory duties set out above.
- 27 Such an Injunction would be of benefit to persons generally throughout the Black Country.
- The proposed Injunction does not interfere with rights and freedoms of the Defendants since the behaviour that it seeks to prohibit is illegal and/or anti-social. The Defendants remain free to attend lawful motor-sports events and exhibitions.

Power of Arrest

- 29 Section 27 of the Police and Justice Act 2006 provides *inter alia:*
 - "(1) This section applies to proceedings in which a local authority is a party by virtue of section 222 of the Local Government Act 1972 (c 70) (power of local authority to bring,

defend or appear in proceedings for the promotion or protection of the interests of inhabitants of their area).

- (2) If the court grants an injunction which prohibits conduct which is capable of causing nuisance or annoyance to a person it may, if subsection (3) applies, attach a power of arrest to any provision of the injunction.
- (3) This subsection applies if the local authority applies to the court to attach the power of arrest and the court thinks that either—
 - (a) the conduct mentioned in subsection (2) consists of or includes the use or threatened use of violence, or
 - (b) there is a significant risk of harm to the person mentioned in that subsection..."
- The Claimants aver that car cruising causes and is capable of causing nuisance or annoyance to persons in the Black Country and that the car cruising creates a significant risk of harm to such persons.

Service of this Claim Form

31 The Claimants seek orders for service of the Claim Form and supporting documentation by alternative means pursuant to CPR 6.15 & 6.27. The proposed steps to effect service are set out in a draft Order. Such steps are likely to bring this Claim and the hearing of the application for an Injunction to the attention of those persons who

may wish to oppose the making of the order or intervene in the proceedings.

Service of any Injunction Granted

32 The Claimants will also seek an order dispensing with personal service of the Injunction. The proposed steps to bring the order to the attention of persons likely to be affected by any Injunction are set out in a draft order.

33 The Claimants submit that such steps are likely to ensure that awareness of the existence of the Injunction will be widespread throughout the Black Country.

And the Claimants claim:

- (1) An Injunction Order in the form annexed hereto;
- (2) A Power of Arrest ancillary to such Injunction;
- (3) Such further or other relief as the Court thinks fit.

WITNESS STATEMENT OF PARDIP NAGRA

- I, Pardip Nagra, Anti-Social Behaviour Team Leader of Wolverhampton Homes, Wednesfield Housing Office, Alfred Squire Road, Wednesfield, Wolverhampton, WV11 1XU, WILL SAY AS FOLLOWS:
- 1. Except where indicated to the contrary, the facts in this statement are within my knowledge and are true. Where the facts in this statement are not within my direct knowledge, they are based on the source indicated and are true to the best of my information and belief.
- 2. I make this statement further to my statement dated 2nd May 2023 and following the interim injunction that was granted by Mrs Justice Hill sitting at the High Court (Royal Courts of Justice) London on 21st December 2022 against persons unknown regarding the issue of street racing within the Black Country.
- 3. I can advise that Wolverhampton's Anti-social behaviour (ASB) Team have received an increase in complaints of street racing within Wolverhampton, in recent months. Residents, often anonymously, have reported street racing occurring on weekends and on occasions, during mid-week.
- 4. Residents have advised that they are being caused nuisance, annoyance and distress by the street racing and have also expressed concerns for other road users whilst racers drive at such dangerous and erratic speeds.
- 5. Examples of complaints of street racing received by Wolverhampton's ASB Team are detailed within two anonymous emails that the ASB Team received in their ASB Duty email inbox on Sunday 10th September. The first email, received at 00.01 on 10th September detailed that hundreds of cars were racing and revving their engines on Overfield Drive, Bilston, Wolverhampton. The author of the email advised that they were considering selling their home as they could no longer deal with the noise from the street racing.

- 6. The second email, received at 0951 on 10th September detailed approximately 100 cars were racing on the Black Country Route in Wolverhampton and that another group where parked and revving their engines on Overfield Drive, Bilston, Wolverhampton. Copies of the above emails are here and exhibited to this statement as "PN1".
- 7. Unfortunately, many of the emails that the ASB Team have received indicate that residents are unhappy with High Court injunction that has been sought in this matter as they do not feel that drivers/racers are abiding by the conditions of the injunction and are simply ignoring it.
- 8. Whilst the above feedback is of course disappointing, it does show that street racing within Wolverhampton is a continuing problem and that the need for a full injunction order is still required. Police resources are very stretched at present and due to the transient nature of street racing, Police are regularly faced with the challenge of directing their limited resources of Police patrols to areas before street racers have moved on to a different location within the Black Country or further afield.
- 9. Whilst enforcement of the High Court injunction has proved challenging as above, arrests of racers have been made and Wolverhampton currently have one breach of the injunction to be heard in upcoming committal proceedings.
- 10. In order to ensure that signage informing street racers of the interim High Court injunction in Wolverhampton is still in situ, I have recently requested Police to carry out a review of our signage. I am informed by PC 23140 Soomal-Goode that all signage erected in Wolverhampton, bar 3 small foamex signs on Springvale Avenue, Wolverhampton remain in situ. I can confirm that arrangements have been made to have the above foamex signs replaced within the coming weeks.

- 11. I have also liaised with representatives of Sandwell and Dudley Councils, in order to ascertain how the interim High Court injunction is affecting street racing within their local authority areas.
- 12. ASB Town Lead Pardip Sandhu, of Sandwell Metropolitan Council, informs me that Sandwell's ASB Team have continued to receive complaints of car cruising. The complaint received have included incidents of unknown persons riding off road motorcycles and quad bikes along canal towpaths, parks, fields and even setting them alight after use.
- 13. Five arrests have been made for alleged breaches of the High Court injunction for street racing. These alleged breaches have predominantly occurred on Kenrick Way, West Bromwich. Sandwell MBC are awaiting dates for committal proceedings in these matters.
- 14. Pardip Sandhu has also informed me that he carried out a review of signage along Kenrick Way on 7th September 2023 and found that two of the signs previously located there have been removed by unknown persons, without permission. It is Pardip's belief that the signs have been removed by persons involved or in support of street racing activities. The missing signs have since been re-ordered. A copy of Pardip Sandhu's statement detailing the above information is here and exhibited to this statement as exhibit "PN2".
- 15. Community Safety Officer Mark Wilson of Dudley Metropolitan Borough Council has also provided me with a statement regarding an update of street racing activities and signage within their Borough.
- 16. Mark advised that Dudley's Highways Department carried out an inspection of their street racing signage on 9th September 2023 and found that all signage was intact and free from damage. The only exception to this was a sign that required realigning so as to easily be viewed/read by road users. This sign is situated on the splitter island on the Manor Way at the George Road roundabout.

- 17. Mark also advised that street racing activities have continued within Dudley during the summer months, most notably at Manor Way, Halesowen, where residents advise that car cruising is regularly taking place. A copy of Mark Wilson's statement is here and exhibited to this statement as "PN3".
- 18. In view of the above information, I believe that street racing is still continuing within the Black Country and is in fact increasing in regularity. For this reason, I fully support the application for a full High Court injunction to address street racing and am willing to give evidence in support of the application.

- I, Pardip Sandhu, Town Lead Anti-Social Behaviour Officer for Sandwell Metropolitan Borough Council, based in Oldbury, Sandwell, West Midlands, WILL SAY AS FOLLOWS:
- Except where indicated to the contrary, the facts in this statement are within
 my knowledge and are true. Where the facts in this statement are not within
 my direct knowledge, they are based on the source indicated and are true to
 the best of my information and belief.
- I make this statement further to my statement dated 27th September 2022 and following the interim injunction that was granted by Mrs Justice Hill sitting at the High Court (Royal Courts of Justice) London on 21st December 2022 against persons unknown regarding the issue of street racing within the Black Country.
- With regard to street racing complaints received in Sandwell since the interim injunction was granted, Sandwell has continued to receive further complaints from local residents including complaints of car cruising, unknown persons riding off road motorcycles and quad bikes along canal towpaths, parks, fields and even setting them alight after use.
- 4. The calls for service have continued as they were prior to the interim injunction and has resulted in 5 arrests being made mainly on Kenrick Way, West Bromwich. These are currently awaiting hearing dates for committal proceedings in September and October 2023.
 - 5. I can confirm that following recent events and arrests made on Kenrick Way, West Bromwich, I visited the sites on Thursday 7th September 2023 and from this visit I can report that two signs that were installed along Kenrick Way, are no longer present and their removal was not authorised.

6. I can confirm that the signs that were installed were visually verified, by ASB Manager Andrew Clarke after installation. I can advise that they have been

removed without permission.

7. It is notable that the signs that remains, is located along a strip of the duel

carriageway where there is no pedestrian footpath or easily accessible

pedestrian access leading to it. As such, it is unlikely that spectators would

have been at this location and an absence of associated litter supports this.

8. This sign remains in place and is located right by traffic lights, near to the island

junction with Telford Way. Notably, this would normally be near what would

constitute the logical Start or Finish line, for any street racing along Kenrick

Way.

9. The Injunction is needed to deter further activity and for the Police and the local

authority to take enforcement action against individuals involved in this activity.

10. I therefore fully support all the authorities in the application for the injunction.

I, MARK WILSON, Community Safety Officer, will say as follows:-

1. I am employed by Dudley Metropolitan Borough Council as a Community Safety Officer. As the Borough's lead for Anti-Social Behaviour, Car Cruising, Public Space Protection Orders, Prevent and Hate Crime, part of my role is to ensure that Dudley is a safe place to live, work and visit and to work collaboratively across the West Midlands region in respect of community safety issues. 2. Subsequent to my first statement, dated 25th April 2023, I have been asked to update the Court on two issues, the state of repair of the warning signs prohibiting car cruising in the area and the extent to which car cruising is a problem within the area.

State of repair of the warning signs

3. On 9th September 2023, Nick Hooper, Maintenance Manager, Highways, reported that he had undertaken an inspection of all the warning signs within the area and that the signs were intact and free from damage, except for one sign, which required re-alignment. The sign that required re-aligning is depicted in the photograph attached to this statement, marked "Exhibit MW1", which is situated on the splitter island on the Manor Way at the Grange Road Roundabout. It needs realigning as it has been turned and is not facing the approaching traffic, so that the sign can be clearly read.

Extent to which car cruising is a problem within the area

4. As the lead Officer for the Authority with responsibility I am aware of significant incidents of car cruising taking place across this borough. This is often raised with me as a concern by members of the public in my daily duties once they become aware of my role. Often, I deliver training in professional settings such as schools and local authority departments and people attending express concern about car cruising especially in respect of Manor Way most recently.

- 5. Since the injunction was granted on 22nd December 2022, complaints of street racing continue to be received in respect of Manor Way, Halesowen and these have increased during the recent summer months. We are also aware that there continues to be regular 'meetup's' of groups in car parks across the borough to do 'donut' stunts and speed around the enclosed area. A 'donut' is a manoeuvre performed while driving a vehicle, which entails rotating the rear or front of the vehicle around the opposite set of wheels in a continuous motion, creating a circular skid-mark pattern of rubber on a carriageway and possibly even causing the tires to emit smoke from friction. This has happened in several locations (Waterfront and Showcase Cinema for example); largely at night but there have been such gatherings in the early evenings too.
- 6. I have witnessed footage on social media of car cruising across the black country and I have seen footage of cars congregating on Manor way in an unsafe way around the shell petrol station.
- 7. I believe that the injunction has had a positive effect and continues to be a necessary tool to ensure the public safety and protection of law abiding members of the public and businesses who have suffered for many years from the negative impact of car cruising and street racing. However, as sought, the terms of the injunction demonstrably need widening.

8. I believe the facts stated in this statement to be true. I understand that proceedings for contempt may be brought against anyone who makes, or causes to be made, a false statement in a document verified by a statement of truth without an honest belief in its truth.

WITNESS STATEMENT OF STEVEN GITTINS

I, STEVEN JOHN GITTINS, Community Safety Manager, Walsall Metropolitan Borough Council, Civic Centre, Darwall Street, Walsall, WS1 1TP ("the Council") WILL SAY AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. I make this statement further to that which I made on 3rd May 2023.
- 2. This statement relates to the Black Country boroughs' application for an injunction prohibiting people from engaging in street racing and car cruising. An injunction was initially granted from 1 February 2014 to 1 February 2018, and subsequently extended until it lapsed on 1 February 2021. A further interim injunction was granted on 22 December 2022 and subsequently extended in February 2023. I provided evidence in support of both the original and subsequent applications.

- 3. There have to date been no applications for committals for breaches of the above injunction in the Borough of Walsall.
- 4. As per my previous statement It remains the case that problems associated with street racing and car cruising related activity within the borough, continue to be reduced since the original car cruising injunction and then subsequent injunctions came into effect.
- 5. Since making my previous statement in May of this year the Council's Community Protection Team has received a further 8 direct reports concerning anti-social behaviour relating to "joy riding/motor vehicles". Police report that since the 4th May this year, they have recorded 126 incident logs for the borough which contain the word racing. Although there are reports from across the borough, Darlaston, Moxley and Junction 9 of the M6/Black Country Route remain areas of concern.
- 6. Although the number and frequency of car cruising related incidents in Walsall has as previously reported reduced since the original injunction was granted, there remain areas of concern and reports of this ant-social activity and the dangers associated with it are still received and are of concern. The real concern remains that if an injunction were not in place and word of this spread, then the level of street racing and car cruising activity would increase, as would the danger and significant anti-social behaviour associated with it. Equally if Walsall were not included within any Black Country Order, there is a real risk that activity prohibited elsewhere would simply be displaced into the borough from its neighbours, facilitated by the arterial and other road networks.
- 7. It is still my belief that the grant of the previous injunctions has had a very beneficial effect in reducing the level of anti-social behaviour and significant danger caused by street racing and car cruising. It continues to be the case that the Council, in seeking this injunction, has in mind the need to protect the lives of the inhabitants of the borough, and the need to protect people from

unnecessary serious injury or death. The injunction is an important means by which this can be achieved.

THIRD WITNESS STATEMENT OF PC MARK CAMPBELL

- I, MARK CAMPBELL, Police Constable 6018 of West Midlands Police, currently stationed at Chelmsley Wood police station, WILL SAY AS FOLLOWS:
- I am PC 6018 Campbell, and I am making this statement on behalf of the West Midlands Police in support of the claimant's application for a new Section 222 High Court street racing injunction in relation to Street racing within the Black Country local authority area.
- 2. I have been a Police officer for over 26 years and have worked on a number of specialist teams including Road Policing Unit. I am now the subject lead for Operation Hercules, which is the West Midlands Police tactical approach to combating street racing, which over the last couple of years has become an ever-growing issue.
- 3. I have been the West Midlands lead on this subject for 4 years, and in that time, I have witnessed the ever increasing professionally organised approach that the street racing organisers are taking to facilitate these events. I have had a leading role in a number of different tactics utilised to tackle the issue of street cruises and the inevitable anti-social behaviour caused. This application, however, is made knowing the positive impact a further injunction would have in supporting the Police to tackle the unlawful behaviour of the individuals who put the public at risk on a weekly basis.
- 4. I have been asked to provide evidence of the impact that the High Court interim injunction has had since my last statement from April 2023, and I can inform the court that during the last 4 months a number of large-scale enforcement operations have been conducted by Force Traffic, namely Road Harm Prevention Team. This has resulted in 6 drivers being arrested for breaching the Black Country High Court Street cruising injunction. These individuals are awaiting court hearings.

- 5. Running parallel with this type of enforcement, investigation work is taking place to target the main street racing organiser groups, previously 3 of these organisers have been arrested, two of which have pleaded guilty, and one is awaiting trial. Approximately 200 drivers have been prosecuted for various offences including careless driving, speeding and general common use type offences.
- 6. There is a perception within the general public is that car cruising has increased and that the Police and Local authorities are doing little to combat the illegal street racing within the streets of the Black Country and further afield. This is simply not the case, a dedicated team of officers are deployed every weekend to target illegal street racing, this team will also have the assistance of West Midlands Police traffic department and local Police teams.
- 7. The Police respond to reports of street racing in a number of ways including the use of intelligence systems, calls from the general public, and Police knowledge from previous dealings. However, the number of officers used on a weekly basis only detracts from other areas of Police work that cannot be tackled due to the Policing of the street cruisers.
- 8. As I had earlier touched on, over the last 4 months there have been 6 drivers arrested for breaching the Black Country Street Cruising Injunction, the majority of these arrests have taken place along Kenrick Way, Oldbury. A reoccurring argument raised by these drivers is "I didn't know there was an injunction" or "I didn't see any signs", in most cases the drivers will have passed a number of High Court Black Country Street Cruising Injunction signs advertising the presence of the injunction within that geographical area.
- 9. In my experience, the street racers that attend the street cruising events are a very tight group of individuals, who are all followers of the main street racing social media accounts and will be more than aware of the High Court injunction banning street cruising. I am aware that a number of posts on these social media sites have informed followers to deny any knowledge of the injunctions

within the West Midlands, but on speaking on a one to one with drivers who attend my diversion/educational course, they all admit knowing that there is an injunction in place, but due to sheer numbers of attendees they feel safe to attend believing that the chances are they will not be arrested.

- 10. With this in mind, officers from Operation Hercules have recently checked locations around the Black Country, where signage was placed advertising the Street cruising injunction, I can confirm that on Kenrick Way, Oldbury, there were originally three Yellow foamex boards attached to lampposts with cable ties, these signs advertised the injunction. However, all of these signs had been cut down presumably by spectators. I also found that one large metal sign on Black Country Route, Bilston, and two other foamex boards on Springvale Avenue had also been removed. The removal of these Injunction signs only goes to reinforce the belief that the racers can deny all knowledge of the injunction and therefore make them believe that they will not be prevent them from being prosecuted.
- 11. The number of street racing meets has naturally increased as we entered the Summer months, new tactics have been initiated in recent weeks that has and will continue to have a massive impact on the street racers, a worrying trend now is that the increased number of gatherings has attracted a larger number of spectators and the increased potential of threat to life from the dangerous driving shown by the attendees to the race meets.
- 12. Unfortunately, the more spectators that attend the meets the faster the drivers go and the more risks they take. I strongly believe that spectators should be covered under the terms of the High Court order, which currently they are not. The introduction of this power would give the Police the power to target this group of individuals who actively encouraging the poor driving.
- 13.I believe the application to renew the interim High Court Street cruising injunction within the Black Country area was required and I further believe an

injunction remains extremely necessary to deter large scale street cruising meets that blight the lives of local residents.

TENTH WITNESS STATEMENT OF PAUL STEVEN BROWN

I, PAUL STEVEN BROWN of the City of Wolverhampton Council, Civic Centre, St Peter's Square, Wolverhampton, WV1 1RG WILL SAY AS FOLLOWS:

- Except where indicated to the contrary, the facts in this statement are within my knowledge and are true. Where the facts in this statement are not within my direct knowledge, they are based on the source indicated and are true to the best of my information and belief. This is my third statement in these proceedings.
- 2. The City of Wolverhampton Council is the authority which is leading the joint application of the Councils of Wolverhampton, Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall (hereinafter referred to as the "Black Country Boroughs") seeking injunctive relief to restrain street racing (also referred to as car cruising) in the Black Country Boroughs.
- 3. I have been employed since 25 June 2007 as a Senior Communications Adviser and latterly Communications Manager in the communications team of the City of Wolverhampton Council.
- 4. In collaboration with my colleagues Pardip Nagra (ASB Team Leader) and Adam Sheen (Senior Solicitor, Legal Services) a communications plan has been developed, with the initial steps implemented, initially to raise awareness of the application to the High Court for an interim street racing injunction for the Black Country Area and, should the court be minded to grant this, to promote the existence of the injunction, and the power of arrest, once it is formally in place.
- Recognising this is a joint enterprise, I have been liaising closely with my counterparts in the communications teams of Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall Councils and West Midlands Police. This is my tenth statement within these proceedings.
- 6. I make this statement to update the Court on activity pursuant to the Paragraphs 5(9) of the Injunction granted 21 December 2022 and paragraph 5(9) of the order of 13 February Sealed 16 February, in which the Claimants were required to:

"Request that West Midlands Police

- (a) Post on their Website, Facebook, Twitter and Instagram account, a link to the media release [the release we send out telling the world about the grant of the injunction and the continuation of the injunction respectively]
- (b) Ensure that copies of the Injunction and Power of Arrest are available at the Front Desks of their stations throughout the Black Country Area".

These steps were to be completed by 23:59 on 23 December 2022 and 21 February 2023 respectively.

- 7. I am patently aware and humbly admit that not all of these steps were completed within the deadline set in paragraph 5 of the Injunction granted 21 December 2022 and paragraph 5(9) of the order of 13 February. This arose due to an oversight arising from the considerable efforts and focus the Claimants necessarily had on ensuring compliance with the many service steps required of them in the other paragraphs of the orders detailed above.
- 8. On behalf of the four Claimant Councils, I profusely and sincerely apologise to the Court and stress no disrespect was intended to the honourable court.
- 9. I can confirm that requests were made on a regular basis to West Midlands Police to share information via their social media channels, including that relating to the outcomes of the hearings in December and February as required in Paragraphs 5(9) of the Injunction granted 21 December 2022 and paragraph 5(9) of the order of 13 February Sealed 16 February. Please see Exhibit PB10A attached hereto for screengrabs of social media shared on Facebook and Twitter by West Midlands Police and the borough social media channels of Wolverhampton, Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall Police.
- 10. However, regrettably, a request for information to be posted on the West Midlands Police website was only made on 4 May 2023. This was complied with, via a link to the City of Wolverhampton Council street racing page where injunction, power

of arrest, review hearing notice and a wealth of information relating to the injunction application is laid out. Please see **Exhibit PB10A attached hereto**.

- 11. Further, a request was only made to West Midlands Police for the first time on 4 May 2023 to arrange for the printing and maintaining of hard copies of the injunction, power of arrest and review hearing notice at front desks of the police stations in the local policing units of Dudley, Sandwell, Walsall and Wolverhampton. The Council received confirmation from Police Constable Mark Campbell of West Midlands Police on 5 May 2023 that this request had been received and had been assigned to the necessary personnel within West Midlands Police to address such request.
- 12. Although the Claimants do not seek in any way to hide from this late compliance, I respectfully contend no prejudice has been caused and, respectfully suggest that it is the totality of the other publicity steps carried in by the Claimants, and in particular social media communications, all of which were completed timeously and well within the deadlines ordered by the honourable court, that will have had the greatest impact on disseminating information to Persons Unknown likely affected by this injunction and thereby serving the injunction, power of arrest and notices of hearings.
- 13. Nevertheless, I wish to place on record the Claimants' sincere and profuse apologies for this delayed compliance addressed herein which was entirely due to the Claimants' oversight. I further confirm a very careful note will be taken of deadlines for any and all future service steps ordered by the honouarable court in relation to this application for injunctive relief to avoid any future repetition of such delayed compliance.
- 14. I thank the honourable Court for its attention in this matter.

Step 2: Investigation

Across the West Midlands we are working with local councils to use injunctions to ban car cruising.

"Burnouts" – causing a vehicle to destroy its tyres by applying power to the drive wheels while braking so as to remain in place while the wheels revolve at speed

"Donuts/Donutting" – causing a vehicle to rotate around a fixed point (normally the front axle) while not moving-off causing noise, smoke and tyre marks to be created

"Drifting" – turning by placing the vehicle in a skid so that most sideways motion is due to the skid not any significant steering input

"Undertaking" – Passing a vehicle on its nearside so as to overtake in circumstances not permitted by the Highway Code.

The Injunction has a Power of Arrest attached to it which gives the police the power to arrest anyone who breaches it.

Breach of an injunction is a contempt to court and if proved the court has the power to impose a sentence of imprisonment, a fine, or an order seizing a person's assets.







I, PAUL STEVEN BROWN of the City of Wolverhampton Council, Civic Centre, St Peter's Square, Wolverhampton, WV1 1RG WILL SAY AS FOLLOWS:

- Except where indicated to the contrary, the facts in this statement are
 within my knowledge and are true. Where the facts in this statement are
 not within my direct knowledge, they are based on the source indicated
 and are true to the best of my information and belief. This is my 14th
 statement in these proceedings.
- 2. The City of Wolverhampton Council is the authority which is leading the joint application of the Councils of Wolverhampton, Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall (hereinafter referred to as the "Black Country Boroughs") seeking injunctive relief to restrain street racing (also referred to as car cruising) in the Black Country Boroughs.
- I have been employed since 25 June 2007 as a Senior Communications
 Adviser and latterly Communications Manager in the communications team of the City of Wolverhampton Council.
- 4. In collaboration with my colleagues Pardip Nagra (ASB Team Leader) and Adam Sheen (Senior Solicitor, Legal Services) a communications plan has been developed, with the initial steps implemented, initially to raise awareness of the application to the High Court for an interim street racing injunction for the Black Country Area and, should the court be minded to grant this, to promote the existence of the injunction, and the power of arrest, once it is formally in place.
- Recognising this is a joint enterprise, I have been liaising closely with my counterparts in the communications teams of Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall Councils and West Midlands Police.
- 6. The order of the High Court made by the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie on 19 May 2023 required the Claimants to take a series of publicity steps publicising the outcome of the hearing to bring notice of the hearing to the attention of "Persons Unknown".

- 7. The information below details these steps and how, I respectfully suggest, the Claimant Councils have fulfilled these steps.
- 8. Issuing a media release highlighting the continuation of the Injunction and Power of Arrest

Such release must provide:

- (a) Details of the application and summarise the orders made;
- (b) Any deadline for filing any documents by the Defendants;
- (c) The date, time and location of any future hearings, if known
- (d) The addresses of the dedicated webpages maintained by the Claimants regarding car cruising;
- (e) The Claimants' contact details; and
- (f) Details of where and how copies of the Injunction, Power of Arrest, this Order, the Documents and the Evidence may be obtained.



The interim injunction banning 'street racing', also known as 'car cruising', in the Black Country has been extended by the High Court, with minor alterations, at a hearing on Friday (19 May, 2023).

The interim injunction prohibits people from participating, as a driver, a rider or a passenger, in a gathering of two or more people at which some of those present engage in motor racing or motor stunts or other dangerous or obstructive driving.

It covers the whole of the boroughs of Wolverhampton, Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall and anyone breaching it will be in contempt of court and could face penalties including imprisonment, a fine or an order to have their assets seized.

The interim injunction and power of arrest were initially granted by the Honourable Mrs Justice Hill in December, continued by the Honourable Mr Justice Freedman in February and reviewed and continued by The Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie at the High Court in Birmingham on Friday, with minor amendments to both the injunction and power of arrest

The injunction remains interim at this stage, pending a judgment from the Supreme Court which is currently considering a similar injunction served against persons unknown, which may have a bearing on the Black Country case. In the meantime, there will be a further case management hearing later this year.

The application was led by the City of Wolverhampton Council on behalf of Dudley Council, Sandwell Council and Walsall Council, and supported by West Midlands Police.



Time to rid our roads of dangerous street racers for good, says MP, after latest action

Nicola Richards MP has welcomed the temporary measure but says more is needed to tackle street racing









A Black Country MP has welcomed an interim car cruising ban to tackle "dangerous" street racing on the region's streets. The interim measure was approved by the High Court last Friday, May 19, banning people from racing or carrying out stunts in <u>Dudley</u>, Sandwell, <u>Walsall</u> and

The interim measure was first made in December, and then extended in February, before it was reextended last week. It comes after Ben Corfield, 19 and Liberty Charris, 16, were killed at an alleged car meet in Oldbury in November. And it also follows a BirminghamLive investigation which revealed how highly reckless and dangerous driving by street racers are being openly advertised on social media.

Welcoming the interim measure, Ms Richards who represents West Bromwich East said: "I'm pleased to see that the injunction against car cruising in the Black Country has been extended. Racing on our streets is dangerous and it has tragically cost people their lives.

"The injunction gives police the power to arrest people taking part anywhere in the Black Country, a power they would not otherwise have. Whilst it is an important short-term measure, it has to be part of a wide-ranging operation to drive this dangerous activity off our streets.

"I'll be working with the police and pushing local councils to do even more to tackle this dangerous behaviour on our roads." Wolverhampton Council said the injunction "prohibits people from participating, as a driver, a rider or a passenger, in a gathering of two or more people at which some of those present engage in motor racing or motor stunts or other dangerous or obstructive driving".

The interim injunction will be in place until the next hearing is made, but there has been no date set at the moment. Wolverhampton said the injunction "remains interim at this stage, pending a judgment from the Supreme Court which is currently considering a similar injunction served against persons unknown, which may have a bearing on the Black Country case".

Councillor Jasbir Jaspal, Wolverhampton Council's cabinet member for adults and wellbeing, added: "We are pleased that the High Court has seen fit to continue the street racing injunction, which is certainly having an effect on preventing meets from occurring in our region. Tougher measures needed to tackle 'dangerous' car cruising, says West Bromwich MP

An MP has called for tougher measures to tackle car cruising on the roads of the Black Country.

Nicola Richards welcomed the extension of an interim street racing injunction, which was approved by the High Court and covers Dudley, Sandwell, Walsall and Wolverhampton.

It means anyone participating as a driver, a rider or a passenger, in a gathering of two or more people where some of those present engage in motor racing or motor stunts can face penalties including prison or a fine.

But the West Bromwich East MP said the injunction should only be seen as a "short-term measure".

She said: "I'm pleased to see that the injunction against car cruising in the Black Country has been extended.

"Racing on our streets is dangerous and it has tragically cost people their lives. The injunction gives police the power to arrest people taking part anywhere in the Black Country, a power they would not otherwise have.

"Whilst it is an important short-term measure, it has to be part of a wide-ranging operation to drive this dangerous activity off our streets.

"I'll be working with the police and pushing local councils to do even more to tackle this dangerous behaviour on our roads."

The interim injunction has now been extended twice since it was first brought in last December

Wolverhampton Council, which led the application on behalf of the other local authorities, said the injunction remains interim pending a judgement from the Supreme Court which is currently considering a similar injunction served against persons unknown, which may have a bearing on the Black Country case.

It comes after Ben Corfield, aged 19 and Liberty Charris, 16, both from Dudley, were killed at an alleged car meet in Oldbury in November.

Would-be 'street racers' and 'car cruisers' are being warned they could face a prison sentence if they breach the interim High Court injunction in force across the Black Country.

The interim injunction banning 'street racing', also known as 'car cruising', prohibits people from participating, as a driver, a rider or a passenger, in a gathering of two or more people at which some of those present engage in motor racing or motor stunts or other dangerous or obstructive driving.

It came into effect in December 2022 and was ordered to continue by the High Court at a hearing on 19 May 2023. It covers the whole of the boroughs of Wolverhampton, Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall and anyone breaching it will be in contempt of court and could face penalties including imprisonment, a fine or an order to have their assets seized.

The application was led by the City of Wolverhampton Council on behalf of Dudley Council, Sandwell Council and Walsall Council, and supported by West Midlands Police.

Councillor Jasbir Jaspal, the council's Cabinet Member for Adults and Wellbeing, said: "People who are thinking of taking part in street racing or car cruising should be under no illusions as to the penalties they may face.

FIFTEENTH WITNESS STATEMENT OF PAUL STEVEN BROWN

- I, PAUL STEVEN BROWN of the City of Wolverhampton Council, Civic Centre, St Peter's Square, Wolverhampton, WV1 1RG WILL SAY AS FOLLOWS:
 - 1. Except where indicated to the contrary, the facts in this statement are within my knowledge and are true. Where the facts in this statement are not within my direct knowledge, they are based on the source indicated and are true to the best of my information and belief. This is my 15th statement in these proceedings.
 - 2. The City of Wolverhampton Council is the authority which is leading the joint application of the Councils of Wolverhampton, Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall (hereinafter referred to as the "Black Country Boroughs") seeking injunctive relief to restrain street racing (also referred to as car cruising) in the Black Country Boroughs.
 - 3. I have been employed since 25 June 2007 as a Senior Communications Adviser and latterly Communications Manager in the communications team of the City of Wolverhampton Council.
 - 4. In collaboration with my colleagues Pardip Nagra (ASB Team Leader) and Adam Sheen (Senior Solicitor, Legal Services) a communications plan has been developed, with the initial steps implemented, initially to raise awareness of the application to the High Court for an interim street racing injunction for the Black Country Area and, should the court be minded to grant this, to promote the existence of the injunction, and the power of arrest, once it is formally in place.
 - Recognising this is a joint enterprise, I have been liaising closely with my counterparts in the communications teams of Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall Councils and West Midlands Police.
 - 6. The order of the High Court made by the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie on 19 May 2023 required the Claimants to take a series of publicity steps publicising the outcome of the hearing to bring notice of the hearing to the attention of "Persons Unknown".

7. As a result, a range of communications activity has taken place following the hearing of 19 May 2023, and these are described in my 14th statement. The court may wish to know that a total of 24 posts were issued on social media (Facebook, Twitter (now called 'X') and Instagram between 19 May and 15 September 2023. These achieved:

Reach of 152.7k. This is described by Orlo, the social media management system used by the City of Wolverhampton Council as follows: "This shows you the total number of times the posts in this campaign have been seen by different people. Please note, Twitter doesn't provide us with this data so stats from this network are not included in this total.

Impressions of 204k. "This gives you the total number of times the posts in this campaign have been shown on a person's screen."

Engagement rate 0.2%. "This shows the level of engagement the content you have shared has generated during the campaign."

Total comments 59. "This is the total number of public comments or mentions received for the reported time period."

Total likes 145

Shares/retweets 118

ORDER

Before the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie sitting at the High Court of Justice, Birmingham District Registry, Priory Courts, 33 Bull Street, Birmingham, B4 6DS on 19 May 2023

UPON hearing:

- (i) Mr Singleton of counsel for the Claimants in Claim No. KB-2022-BHM-000188 (respectively the "Wolverhampton Claimants" and the "Wolverhampton claim") and
- (ii) Mr Manning of counsel for the Claimants in Claim No. KB-2022-BHM-000221 (respectively "Birmingham CC" and the "Birmingham claim"),

AND UPON there being no appearance by any Defendant, and no other person having notified the Court, the Wolverhampton Claimants or Birmingham CC that they wished to be joined as a party or heard

AND UPON Birmingham CC's application for an interim injunction and power of arrest dated 9 December 2022 pursuant to section 222 Local Government Act 1972 and section 130 Highways Act 1980 and the Wolverhampton Claimants' like application dated 13 December 2022

AND UPON the Court reviewing the grant by the Honourable Mrs Justice Hill of Interim Injunctions and Powers of Arrest dated 22 December 2022 in both the Wolverhampton claim and the Birmingham claim, as required by para.5 of the said Injunctions and para.3 of the Orders of the Honourable Mr Justice Freedman sealed on 16 February 2023.

AND UPON the Court noting the Orders of Mrs Justice Hill sealed on 22 December 2022 in the Wolverhampton claim and the Birmingham claim giving directions and approving service by alternative means pursuant to CPR r.6.27 and CPR r.81.4 of the Interim Injunctions and Powers of Arrest sealed on 22 December 2022 and any further evidence, and noting the like provisions for alternative service contained in the Orders of Mr Justice Freedman sealed on 16 February 2023.

AND UPON the Court considering that in both the Wolverhampton claim and the Birmingham claim further clarification was necessary so as to define the particular categories of Defendant who are Person Unknown to whom the said Interim Injunctions and Powers of Arrest apply

AND UPON

(i) the Wolverhampton claimants undertaking to file an Amended Claim Form and Amended Particulars of Claim to reflect the addition of the 4th Defendant and to specify the tort(s) and/or crime(s) that this Order is intended to prevent or inhibit, referred to above and by 4.00 pm on 9 June 2023

(ii) Birmingham CC undertaking to file a Re-Amended Claim Form and Further Re-Amended Particulars of Claim to reflect the addition to the proceedings of the 10th Defendant referred to above by 4.00 pm on 26 May 2023

AND UPON the Court concluding that, in the circumstances, it would be preferable to continue the said Interim Injunctions and Powers of Arrest granted by Mrs Justice Hill as amended in the form attached at Schedule 1 to this Order rather than to grant new interim injunctions and powers of arrest in order to avoid the potential for confusion that may be caused by the Claimants serving further interim orders by alternative means and difficulty in relation to the enforcement of any alleged breaches by reason of different interim injunctions being in force at different times

AND UPON it appearing to the court that there is good reason to authorise service by a method or place not otherwise permitted by CPR Parts 6 & 81

AND UPON the Wolverhampton claimants and Birmingham CC undertaking to inform the Court forthwith if the Supreme Court delivers judgment in the appeal known as *Wolverhampton City Council and others v London Gypsies and Travellers and others* UKSC/2022/0046

AND UPON the Wolverhampton claimants and Birmingham CC confirming that this Order is not intended to prohibit lawful motorsport taking place on private land where planning permission has been granted (or is not required) and such activities take place under an approved code or licence from a recognised regulatory body.

IT IS ORDERED THAT

Injunctions in force

1. In both the Wolverhampton claim and the Birmingham claim, the Interim Injunctions and Power of Arrest granted by the Honourable Mrs Justice Hill, sealed on 22 December 2022, shall remain in force in the amended form attached at Schedule 1 to this Order until the hearing of the claim unless varied or discharged by further Order of the Court. The said Amended Interim Injunctions and Powers of Arrest shall come into force immediately and be deemed served on the Defendants at 23.59 on the date upon which, in each case, the final step in paragraphs 11 and 13 have been complied with.

Permission to amend

- 2. (i) The Wolverhampton claimants shall have permission to file and serve an Amended Claim Form and Amended Particulars of Claim to add the 4th Defendant in the form set out above and to specify the tort(s) and/or crime(s) that this Order is intended to prevent or inhibit, by 4.00 pm on 9 June 2023.
 - (ii) Birmingham CC has permission to file and serve a Re-Amended Claim Form and Further Re-Amended Particulars of Claim to add the 10th Defendant in the form set out above, by 4.00 pm on 27th May 2023.

Case Management

- 3. There shall be the following further hearings set out below at which hearings the court will consider the Wolverhampton claim and the Birmingham claim together. For the avoidance of doubt, the Wolverhampton claim and the Birmingham claim have not been consolidated but it is convenient for them to be heard together as they raise similar issues.
- 4. A further case management hearing shall take place (time estimate 1 day) before a Judge of the High Court on the first open date after 10 July 2023.
 - (a) Such hearing may be held remotely if the Judge so directs.
 - (b) Further, the Judge may direct that the time estimate be amended.
 - (c) Not less than 7 days prior to the hearing the Wolverhampton claimants and Birmingham CC shall file with the Court case summaries to inform the Court of the current position in particular in relation to the awaited judgment of the Supreme Court in *Wolverhampton CC v London Gypsies and Travellers and others* [2022] UKSC/0046 and any current enforcement proceedings and Defendants to be named in connection with the interim injunction and/or the power of arrest.
 - (d) The Wolverhampton claimants shall take like steps to those identified at paragraph 11(1)-(8) below to publicise the date of such hearing; Birmingham CC shall take like steps to those identified at paragraph 13(1)-(8) to publicise the date of such hearing
 - (e) The Wolverhampton claimants and Birmingham CC have permission to file updating evidence not less than 7 days prior to the hearing. Alternative service of any such evidence may be effected by taking like steps to those set out at sub-paragraph (d) above.
- 5. At the said hearing the court will consider:
 - (i) if known, the effect of the Supreme Court judgment in Wolverhampton City Council and others v London Gypsies and Travellers and others;
 - (ii) appropriate directions, including a time estimate, for the hearing referred to at paragraph 6 below

- 6. There shall be a final hearing, or further review hearing, before a High Court Judge on the first open date after 1 October 2023. The nature of the hearing is to be determined at the case management conference referred to at paragraphs 4-5 above.
- 7. Any person served with a copy of, or affected by, this Order including, for the avoidance of doubt, the Amended Interim Injunctions and Powers of Arrest attached at Schedule 1 to this Order, may apply to the Court to vary or discharge it, on 48 hours written notice to the Wolverhampton claimants or Birmingham CC, whichever be the relevant claimant, at the applicable address set out at the foot of this Order. Further information is attached at Schedules 2 and 3 to this Order.

Service

- 8. In both the Wolverhampton claim and the Birmingham claim, and pursuant to CPR r.6.27 and CPR r.81.4, the steps that the Wolverhampton claimants and Birmingham CC have taken to serve the order of Freedman J sealed on 16 February 2023; notice of this hearing (including of the changed date) and the further evidence filed in advance of this hearing pursuant to para.3(d) and (e) of the order of Freedman J sealed on 16 February 2023 shall amount to good and proper service on the Defendants and each of them.
- 9. Personal service of this Order (including, for the avoidance of doubt, the Amended Interim Injunction and Power of Arrest attached at Schedule 1 to this Order) and the matters referred to at paragraph 4(d) and (e) above is dispensed with in the Wolverhampton claim, and is dispensed with in relation to the Eighth, Ninth and Tenth Defendants in the Birmingham claim pursuant to CPR rules 6.27 and 81.4(2)(c) and (d).
- 10. The Court will provide copies of this Order to the solicitors for the Wolverhampton claimants' and Birmingham CC (whose contact details are set out below) for service.
- 11. In the Wolverhampton claim, service of this Order shall be effected by:
 - (1) Issuing a media release highlighting the continuation of the Injunction and Power of Arrest, such release must provide:
 - (a) Details of the application and summarise the orders made;
 - (b) Any deadline for filing any documents by the Defendants:
 - (c) The date, time and location of any future hearings, if known

- (d) The addresses of the dedicated webpages maintained by the Claimants regarding car cruising;
- (e) The Claimants' contact details; and
- (f) Details of where and how copies of the Injunction, Power of Arrest, this Order, the Documents and the Evidence may be obtained.

Such release shall be made to, but is not limited to, local print publications including the Express and Star, Chronicle Week, the Birmingham Mail, Halesowen & Dudley News and Stourbridge News; local radio stations including BBC WM, Free Radio, Signal 107, WCR FM and Heart; the website Birmingham Live (aka) BLive; and the following television stations, BBC (to include the Midlands Today programme) and ITV Central.

by 23:59 on 26 May 2023

- (2) Placing on the Claimants' social media including Twitter, Facebook and Instagram links to the above media release regarding the granting of the High Court injunction and power of arrest and highlighting the introduction of the injunction and power of arrest by 26 May 2023
- (3) Updating the dedicated pages on the websites of Wolverhampton City Council, Dudley Council, Sandwell Council and Walsall Council about the Injunction and Power of Arrest and this Order: https://www.wolverhampton.gov.uk/street-racing-injunction

- (4) Such pages shall carry a direct link to the Injunction Order, the Power of Arrest, the Order of Freeman J, this Order, the Documents and the Evidence and be updated by 23:59 on 26 May 2023
- (5) Ensuring that the home (or landing) page of each of the Claimants' main websites have and retain a prominent direct link to the dedicated webpages referred to above by 23:59 on 26 May 2023

- (6) Ensuring that copies of the Injunction, the Power of Arrest and this Order are available at the front desks of the Claimants' main offices by 23:59 on 26 May 2023
- (7) Ensuring that the video previously uploaded to the video sharing website "You Tube" and the Claimants' websites and social media pages (including Instagram, Twitter and Facebook), now states that this Order has been made and the Injunction and Power of Arrest continue in force.

This may be done by uploading a fresh video (which must contain all the matters previously ordered by Hill J) or prominently adding text to the existing video (or the description of the existing video on any website or social media page) stating "Following a hearing on 19 May 2023 The Injunction and Power of Arrest continue in force"

Maintaining official road signs (fixed, and temporary) throughout the Black Country Area in locations that are, or have been, hotspots car cruising activity stating "NEW HIGH COURT INJUNCTION PROHIBITING CAR CRUISING AND STREET RACING IN FORCE IN THIS AREA";

12. The Wolverhampton claimants shall file a witness statement confirming that the steps taken to effect service set out at paragraph 11, not less than 7 days before the date of the hearing referred to at paragraphs 4- 5 above. If paragraph 11 has not been fully complied with, the Wolverhampton claimants shall identify the deficiency and provide an explanation so that a Judge may consider whether to authorise retrospective alternative service, pursuant to CPR r. 6.27 & r. 81.4.

- 13. In the Birmingham claim, Birmingham CC shall be permitted to serve the documents referred to at paragraph 9 above on the Eighth Ninth and Tenth Defendants by the following alternative methods.
 - (1) Issuing a media release concerning the continuation of the Injunction and Power of Arrest, such release must provide:
 - (a) a summary of this Order;
 - (b) the date, time and location of any future hearings, if known
 - (d) the addresses of the dedicated webpages maintained by the Claimant regarding street cruising;
 - (e) The Claimants' contact details as set out below; and
 - (f) Details of where and how copies of the interim injunction, power of arrest, this Order and the Claim Form and supporting documentation relied on by the Claimant may be obtained.

Such release shall be made to, but is not limited to, local print publications including the Express and Star, Chronicle Week, the Birmingham Mail, Halesowen & Dudley News and Stourbridge News; local radio stations including BBC WM, Free Radio, Signal 107, WCR FM and Heart; the website Birmingham Live (aka) BLive; and the following television stations, BBC (to include the Midlands Today programme) and ITV Central.

- (b) the area in which they have effect, and

- 14. This Order shall be deemed served on the Defendants at 23.59 on the date upon which, in each case, the final step in paragraph 13 has been complied with.

15. The Claimant shall file a witness statement confirming that the steps taken to effect service set out at paragraph 13, not less than 7 days before the date of the hearing referred to at paragraphs 4-5 above. If paragraph 13 has not been fully complied with the Claimant shall identify the deficiency and provide an explanation so that a judge may consider whether to authorise retrospective alternative service, pursuant to CPR r. 6.27 & r. 81.4.

Further matters

- 16. Without prejudice to the foregoing, any person affected by the Amended Interim Injunction or Power of Arrest in the Wolverhampton claim or the Birmingham claim may apply to the Court at any time to vary or discharge it but if they wish to do so they must inform the relevant Claimants' solicitors immediately (and in any event not less than 48 hours before the hearing of any such application) via the contact details set out below at the foot of this Order. Schedule 2 to this Order indicates the process which must be followed for any such application. Useful sources of support and information are listed in Schedule 3.
- 17. Any person applying to vary or discharge either Amended Interim Injunction or Power of Arrest must provide their full name and address, an address for service, and must also apply to be joined as a Named Defendant to the proceedings at the same time.
- 18. Any Defendant who fails to comply with paragraph 17 above shall not be permitted to defend these proceedings or take any further role in these proceedings without further order of the Court and shall be liable to have injunctive relief continued against them.
- 19. The Wolverhampton claimants and Birmingham CC otherwise have permission to apply to extend or vary the Amended Interim Injunctions and Powers of Arrest or for further directions.

20. SCHEDULE 2 – STEPS TO VARY OR DISCHARGE THIS ORDER

If, in accordance with paragraph 16 above, any Defendant or any other person affected by this Order wishes to apply to vary or discharge this Order, to ensure effective case management by the Court the following indicative steps must be followed:

- 1. Any person seeking to contest the Claimants' entitlement to interim relief should file with the court (i.e. send to the court) and serve (i.e. send to the Claimants):
 - (a) An N244 application form¹;
 - (b) Written grounds (which may be contained in within the N244 application form or a separate document) for:
 - i. permission to bring the application; and

- (c) Send electronic copies of the documents to the relevant e-mail address at paragraph 22 above.
- 4. The person making the application should indicate to the Court and Claimants whether they consider the matter requires a court hearing or can be dealt with by the judge reviewing the paper application and any response from the Claimants.
- 5. Thereafter the Claimants shall have 14 days to file and serve evidence and submissions in response, including as to whether an oral hearing is required to determine the application.
- 6. Within 21 days, the Court shall decide:
 - a whether to grant permission for the application to proceed; and
 - b if permission is granted, whether a hearing is necessary, and/or may request from the parties evidence on any further matters necessary to determine the application. If the Court decides that a hearing is necessary, it shall seek to schedule the hearing (accommodating availabilities of the parties) within 42 days (6 weeks).
- 7. If the Court decides that further evidence is needed from any party, it may set strict deadlines by which that evidence must be filed. Both parties should be aware that the Court may restrict the use of evidence which is filed late or impose other penalties for non-compliance.

This Order was made when the Defendants were not present at court but notice of the Claimants application had been given **Before the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie** sitting at the High Court of Justice, Birmingham District Registry, Priory Courts, 33 Bull Street, Birmingham, B4 6DS on 19 May 2023.

Upon hearing Mr Singleton of counsel for the Claimants and there being no appearance by any other person and neither the Court nor the Claimants having received any notification that any other person wished to be joined as a party or heard.

And Upon the Claimants' application, by an Application Notice dated 7 October 2022 for an injunction pursuant to section 222 Local Government Act 1972 and section 130 Highways Act 1980.

And Upon the Court having granted an Injunction and Power of Arrest, by Order of the Honourable Mrs Justice Hill sealed on 22 December 2022.

And Upon the Court having further reconsidered the grant of the Injunction and Power of Arrest (following a previous review held by the Honourable Mr Justice Freedman on 6 and 13 February 2023), as directed by paragraph 2 of the Order of Freedman J sealed on 16 February 2023.

And Upon the court having exercised its discretion to grant injunctive relief pursuant to section 37(1) Senior Courts Act 1981.

And Upon the Court being satisfied for the purposes of s.27(3), Police and Justice Act 2006, that there is a significant risk of harm to a person or persons from the conduct prohibited by the Injunction Order and that the Power of Arrest should therefore be continued.

And Upon the Court noting the order of the Honourable Mr Freedman sealed on 16 February 2023 giving directions and approving service by alternative means pursuant to CPR r.6.27 and CPR r.81.4 of: that order; and further evidence.

And Upon it appearing to the court that there is good reason to authorise service by a method or place not otherwise permitted by CPR Parts 6 & 81.

And Upon the Claimants renewing their undertaking to inform the Court forthwith if the Supreme Court deliver judgment in the appeal known as *Wolverhampton City Council and others (Respondents) v London Gypsies and Travellers and others (Appellants)* [2022] UKSC/0046.

And Upon the Claimants reconfirming that this Order is not intended to prohibit lawful motorsport taking place on private land where planning permission has been

granted (or is not required) and such activities take place under an approved code or licence from a recognised regulatory body.

And Upon the Court considering that further clarification was necessary as to the particular categories of Defendant who are Person Unknown to whom this injunction and power of arrest applies

And further upon the Claimant undertaking, and being given permission, to file an Amended Claim Form and an Amended Particulars of Claim to reflect the addition to the proceedings of the Fourth Defendant referred to above and to specify the tort(s) and/or crime(s) that this Order is intended to prevent or inhibit. Such amendments to be filed by 4.00pm, 9 June 2023 and served by the same date by adopting like measures to those set out at paragraphs 11 (3) & (6) in the Combined Directions Order.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

Injunction in force

The Injunction and Power of Arrest granted by the Honourable Mrs Justice Hill, sealed on 22 December 2022, shall remain in force save that paragraph 1 of that Order be amended as set out below until the hearing of the claim unless varied or discharged by further Order of the Court

IT IS FORBIDDEN for any of the Fourth Defendants being a driver, rider or passenger in or on a motor vehicle to participate between the hours of 3:00pm and 7:00am in a gathering of 2 or more persons within the Black Country Area shown on Plan A (attached) at which such Defendants engage in motor racing or motor stunts or other dangerous or obstructive driving.

Stunts are driving manoeuvres often undertaken at such gatherings including but not limited to:

- (1) "Burnouts" Causing a vehicle to damage or destroy its tyres by applying power to the drive wheels while braking so as to remain in place while the wheels revolve at speed.
- (2) "Donuts/Donutting" Causing a vehicle to rotate around a fixed point (normally the front axle) while not moving off causing noise, smoke and tyre marks to be created.
- (3) "Drifting" Turning by placing the vehicle in a skid so that most sideways motion is due to the skid not any significant steering input.
- (4) "Undertaking" passing a vehicle on its nearside so as to overtake in circumstances not permitted by the Highway Code

A Power of Arrest pursuant to section 27 Police and Criminal Justice Act 2006 shall apply to paragraph 1 of this Order.

 - (h) The Alternative Service Application.

This Amended Order shall come into force immediately and be deemed served on the Defendants at 23.59 on the date upon which, in each case, the final step in paragraph 11 of the Combined Directions Order have been complied with.

Further Matters

Without prejudice to the foregoing, any person affected by this Amended Interim Injunction or amended Power of Arrest may apply to the Court at any time to vary or discharge it but if they wish to do so they must inform the Claimants' solicitors immediately (and in any event not less than 48 hours before the hearing of any such application).

I should be grateful if you would refer this letter to Her Honour Judge Kelly for her consideration.

I write in relation to the above matter concerning specifically the Practice Direction/Practice Note/Guidance ('the Practice Direction') promulgated by the President of the King's Bench Division directing that Persons Unknown injunction hearings must only be heard by full High Court judges, pending judgment from the Supreme Court in the case of *Wolverhampton City Council and Others v London Gypsies and Travellers and Others* (Supreme Court reference: UKSC 2022/0046).

That case was heard by the Supreme Court on 8 and 9 February 2023 and at present there is no indication of when judgment will be handed down. Lord Reed commented at the end of the hearing:

"We will be as quick as we can, but that does not mean we will be quick".

I write to enquire, most respectfully, whether it would be possible for the Honourable Court to forward a copy of this Practice Direction as no party in the above case has been able to locate a copy of this Practice Direction, despite considerable efforts.


I write to point out, with the utmost deference to the President of the King's Bench Division and intending no disrespect whatsoever, that the Practice Direction seems to cause significant difficulty for the court listing hearings and, in particular, presents problems with hearings following the exercise of the power of arrest attached to the Black Country Car Cruising Injunction.


By way of illustration this matter was last in Court on 9 May before the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie who ordered, amongst other things, that the matter be listed on the first available date after 10 July for a further review hearing. This was only listed on 19 July with a hearing date set of 10 November 2023.

Similarly, although there have not been many instances of the exercise of the power of arrest at the time of writing, the activity of car cruising has been shown to intensify over the summer months and thus, the likelihood of the exercise of the power of arrest also increases.

Furthermore, term finishes at the end of this month which means that any arrests are likely to be dealt with by the vacation judge in London, as there will be far fewer High Court judges on circuit.

If it is the case that following the wording or spirit of the Practice Direction of the President of the King's Bench Division, the first hearing must also be (and must only be) before a full High Court judge, this could be particularly burdensome for the Duty High Court Judge or Vacation Judge.

Typically, such hearings could take place remotely or by telephone, but the honourable judge may require any Defendants to be transported to the Royal Courts of Justice to appear in person, which would present practical difficulties and may mean that production cannot take place within the mandatory period of 24 hours.

When the previous Black Country Car Cruising Injunction (Wolverhampton City Council v Persons Unknown (case no:A90BM228)) was in force (2015-2021), most hearings including all directions hearings, review hearings and committal hearings, were heard by section 9 Judges. Given the developing jurisprudence in Persons Unknown litigation, I respectfully contend it is understandable why a practice direction may require substantive hearings to be reserved to a full High Court judge. However, to assist the honourable Court deal with this matter (and any subsequent committal hearings for breach of this injunction) and the issue of the listing of hearings, I should be grateful if the honourable Court would consider whether committal and directions hearings in respect of the Black Country Car Cruising Injunction case could be dealt with by a section 9 judge.

If a Defendant indicates that he wishes to challenge the legality of the Injunction or the court's jurisdiction to make such an order, directions could be given for a hearing before a full High Court Judge. Indeed, the existing order already provides for a procedure to be followed by those wishing to vary or discharge the Injunction.

I thank you sincerely for your attention in this matter and look forward to hearing from you soon.

And upon the order of the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie dated 19 May 2023 ("the Order") giving case management directions and the Court listing the next hearing date on 10 November 2023

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The case management hearing directed at paragraph 4 of the Order listed on 10 November 2023 shall be vacated and relisted on the first open date after 7 August 2023 before HHJ Kelly. Time estimate 1 day. To proceed as an in person hearing. The directions at paragraph 4(c) – (d) and 5 of the Order shall continue to apply to the

relisted hearing.

- 2. The parties shall file dates of availability for the case management hearing by 4pm on 2 August 2023. Such dates to be sent by email to kb.birmingham@justice.gov.uk The dates of availability must cover the period from 7 August 2023 to 30 September 2023.
- 3. The Claimant in claim KB-2022-BHM-000188 shall effect service of this order and the new notice of hearing in accordance with paragraph 11 of the Order.
- 4. The Claimant in claim number KB-2022-BHM-000221 shall effect service of this order and the new notice of hearing on the 1st to 7th Defendants and, in relation to the 8th 10th Defendants in accordance with paragraph 13 of the Order.
- 5. This order has been made of the Court's own initiative. Any party affected by this order may apply to set aside, vary or stay the order. Any such application to be made within 7 days of service of this order upon the party making the application.

Reasons

- 1. Paragraph 4 of the Order directed that a case management hearing be listed on the first available date after 10 July 2023 before 'a Judge of the High Court.' Paragraph 6 of the order directed that a final hearing or further review hearing be listed before 'a High Court Judge' on the first available date after 1 October 2023.
- 2. The Court staff interpreted paragraph 4 as a requirement to list the case before a full High Court Judge whereas the direction was simply that it be listed before a Judge of the High Court. A Judge of the High Court includes a Judge authorised under s.9(1) or 9(4) of the Senior Courts Act.
- 3. The case management hearing is listed in November; that being the first available date that a High Court Judge was available. Given that the case management hearing does not require a High Court Judge, and that delay is not in the interests of justice or in accordance with the timetable envisaged by paragraph 6 of the Order, the Court exercises its discretion to vacate the current hearing with a view to relisting the case before HHJ Kelly at an earlier point in time.
- 4. It is desirable for the availability of the parties and their legal representatives to be taken into account before a new date is fixed.
