HELPFUL INFORMATION KNOW D YOUR D J



The council and residents both have responsibilities around waste and recycling. The law tells us what we as a council should do, and what you as a resident must do.

Our responsibilities

We have a statutory duty to collect household waste. Part of this duty means setting standards for residents, so they understand how waste should be stored, and how bins should be put out for collection.

Your responsibilities

We'll only collect your bins if they are stored and put out in the right way. Your bins should only contain items we accept as part of your collection. Your bin should be put out by 6.30am on the day of collection and no earlier than 5pm the evening before.

Generally we ask residents to present their bins at the kerbside so that they are clearly visible and can be reached from the highway and not causing an obstruction. Where this is not possible there will be local arrangements in place to ensure collections are safe and accessible for collection crews and passers-by. Bins will not be collected if lids are lifted, waste is placed beside the bin, or the bin contains incorrect items.

Please make sure your bin is taken back to your property on the day it is emptied.

All waste and recycling should be put in the bins provided. There should not be any additional waste put at the side of your bins, this includes black/clear bags. We do not collect extra waste. Extra waste can be taken to our household waste and recycling centres.

Your brown/green general waste bin should not contain garden waste, as it contaminates the bin
