Request and response in 'blue':

- How many newly qualified social workers do you currently employ (ie in their first year of employment)?

- 3. What is the maximum or recommended caseload for ASYE participants? Caseloads are increased incrementally and by 9 months the NQSW should have a 90% caseload in relation to the team that they are based.
- 4. Which teams do ASYE participants work in?
 - a) Please list all teams in your local authority children's and adults' services currently hosting an ASYE participant? Adoption Fostering Looked After Children Children In Need
 - b) Please give examples of the kinds of tasks and roles an ASYE participant would do during their assessed year?
 Work is assessed against the Professional Capabilities Framework and the Knowledge and Skills Statement which are set at the appropriate level of a NQSW. Examples of work include: Child in Need/ Child Protection work and court cases.
- 5. How many hours of supervision do ASYE participants receive per month? Is it

recorded that it has taken place?

For the first 2 months supervision will be every 2 weeks and will be for 1.5 hours. This will increase to 3 weeks and finally 4 weeks over the course of the year. It is logged that it has taken place and is part of the audit of supervisions.
